IAMO strengthens relation to Kazakhstan

In the framework of the bilateral co-operation project "**German-Kazakh Agricultural Policy Dialogue**", launched in the beginning of 2009 by the Federal Ministry of Food, Agriculture and Consumer Protection (BMELV), a delegation of representatives of Kazakh agricultural research institutes and companies recently traveled Germany. On November 13, 2009 the delegation visited IAMO. Besides Rakhim Oshakbayev, General Director of the Analytical Centre of the Economic Policy in Agricultural Sector of Kazakhstan, and his colleagues, the director of the Strategy Department of KazAgroInnovation and a representative from JSC National Centre of Certification and Expertise belonged to the delegation. At the meeting they introduced their work and got an overview of IAMO's main research areas and selected projects. The meeting was a first step to explore the possibilities for future co-operation. First ideas for collaboration were exchanged. **It was suggested that IAMO organises a further training workshop in Kazakhstan in 2010.**

First meetings have taken place at the 27th Conference of the International Association of Agricultural Economists (IAAE) in Beijing this August and lately at the annual conference of the German Association of Agricultural Economists (GeWiSoLa) in October in Kiel. First result of these informal talks: In spring 2010 GeWiSoLa and its Chinese counterpart, the Chinese Association of Agricultural Economics (CAAE), will meet for a three or four days workshop in Beijing. Aim is to become better acquainted with the structures, activities and strategies regarding research and collaborations of both associations and to identify opportunities for joint activities. Researcher in the field: China I

From July to October 2009 Tursinbek Sultan carried out data collection in Zhejiang and Sichuan provinces in China for the project "**Food Supply Chain Development in China – small farmers and farm cooperatives**". Sultan is working on this project with IAMO colleagues Karin Larsen and Alfons Balmann. The data collection was carried out successfully under the help of Zu-hui Huang, Director of the Center for Agricultural and Rural Development of Zhejiang University; one of IAMO's international China project partners. The overall aim of the project is to investigate the dynamic and complex socio-economic reasons for small farmers joining or being excluded from agricultural cooperatives in rural China. During the four months data collection period, more than 600 small farmers (both member farmers and non member farmers of farm cooperatives) have been interviewed, 31 village communities and more than 40 farm cooperatives have been visited in those two provinces. Now the data is prepared for detailed analysis.

Researchers in the field: China II

With lots of data also Zhanli Sun and Jens Frayer recently returned from a nearly three-month-long field trip to Yunnan, a province in Southwestern China. The data collection trip mainly served for the research "**The effects of payments for ecosystem services on human well-being and land use in upland Yunnan, China**" under the support of the "**Economic Dynamics and Social Equilibrium in Rural China**" project. The researchers want to find out why farmers participate in the Sloping Land Conversion Program (SLCP), and evaluate the social-economic effects on farmers besides the land use patterns change. Under the supervision of Daniel Müller and in cooperation with Xu Jianchu of Kunming Institute of Botany/Center for Integrated Mountain Research (CMES), a questionnaire based household survey was conducted in Baoshan and Lijiang Prefecture, where more than 500 farm households were interviewed. Furthermore, the scientists also got background information, important insights and interesting cases or stories through discussion with forestry officials, village leaders and scholars. Although facing various difficulties such as culture and language barriers, harsh rural environment and low village accessibility, the scientists were able to finish their work one month earlier and with one third more questionnaires conducted than initially planned. All this was made possible by the superior support from the local collaborator – Xu and his CMES-team. A close working partnership between IAMO and CMES was established, and future cooperation was also planned out.

Volume 58 (Issue 7 and 8) of the *German Journal of Agricultural Economics* deals with "**20 Years of Transition in the Agri-Food Sector – Analyses of Markets and Policies**". This year's NIÖ workshop was held at IAMO

On November 20, 2009 the **annual meeting of the NIÖ network** took place at IAMO. NIÖ stands **for new institutional economics**. Scientists from universities and research institutes in north and east Germany are the longtime members of the network which concentrates in particular on the analysis of natural resource management and theories of new institutional economics. Representatives of Greifswald University, Humboldt Universität zu Berlin, the Leipzig Helmholtz Centre for Environmental Research – UFZ, the Leibniz Institute for Regional Development and Structural Planning Erkner, Leipzig University, Leibniz University Hannover, Cottbus University and Martin Luther University Halle-Wittenberg were present at the meeting. Six thematically selected presentations were discussed by the committed group of PhD students and senior researchers. The topics ranged from financing opportunities in Germany's biogas sector, institutional reforms in the Werra river basin delta, the concepts of "Gemeinwohl" in Germany up to issues of elite capture in the Albanian fishery sector, Portugal's rescaling process in the water sector and India's gender-specific rice management. The meeting was organised by IAMO researchers Insa Theesfeld and Martin Petrick.

IAMO hosted session at the annual GeWiSoLa meeting

On October 1, 2009 IAMO hosted a session at the [annual meeting of GeWiSoLa](#) which took place in Kiel. Topic was "Twenty years of transition". Alfons Balmann from IAMO showed that in Eastern Europe family farms, in contrast to predictions made at the beginning of the transformation processes, are now more the exception than the rule. Agriculture is defined by dualistic structures, meaning subsistence agriculture exists next to large farms. Globalisation and verticalisation as well as the new trend biological manufacturing accommodate especially large farms as they usually have better qualified employees. Therefore, Balman emphasised the important role of education and training for the future of the agro-food business. How the integration of the sector in Central and Eastern European countries can be analysed via trade theories outlined Imre Fertő from the Hungarian Academy of Science. Transformation processes from the point of view of the Deutsche Gesellschaft für Technische Zusammenarbeit (GTZ) described Detlev Böttcher. Chair of the session was Ulrich Koester from Christian-Albrechts-University of Kiel.
