


Food imports ban direct impact

- Problems with TIR convention execution for transit to Kazakhstan through Russian territory
- Stricter control for veterinary certification on imports from Kazakhstan

CU intra trade statistics issues


- Statistics and customs are not able to fully trace the intra CU trade
- Difference in statistics led to embarrassing situation on highest level meeting

Example: 2013 trade statistics comparison (USD million):

Impacts on wheat sector (1)

- Heavy rains and snow during fall 2014 significantly downgraded wheat quality and volume of harvest
- Producers and millers started looking for high/normal quality wheat to blend own low quality wheat



Impacts on wheat sector (2) Wheat imports from Russia: Wheat price MY 2015,

- 60'000 tons officially
- 500'000 tons Millers association estimate

Presumably, local wheat price were pushed down by Russian imports

Impacts on food processing industry

Production, 1st half of 2015 to 2014:

- poultry: -37%
- vegetable oil and margarine: -21%
- chocolate and confectionary: -20%
- · overall food processing: -15%

bordering zone was affected the most (example of Pavlodar)

Impacts on Kazakhstani economy: anecdotal evidence

- 151 billion rubles sold in Kazakhstan during October 2014 June 2015 (~2.8 USD bn)
- car imports from Russia: 79'332 in 2014 and 151'085 in first half of 2015

Employment in industry (~1 million jobs):

- 7'900 employees lost jobs in 313 companies (4.8 times more than in 2014)
- 7'112 moved to part-time employment
- 2'051 pushed to unpaid vacation
- 2'039 pushed to half-paid vacation

Conclusions

- Food imports ban in Russia has little direct effect on Kazakhstani economy.
- Turbulence in Russian economy and controversial decision making in Kazakhstan decreased competitiveness of domestic producers.
- The effect is not reflected at full scale in trade statistics due to measurement issues and, presumably, unwillingness of statistics office to show the inconvenient picture.
